Welcome back to the 1970s as you enjoy Modern Men's 2025 Spring concert **The 70s Show!** Ah, the 70s – era of home décor in brown, orange, and avocado green. Macrame was all the rage. Space Invaders ate our quarters at the arcade, and the first personal computers were introduced. FM radio stations reached their heyday playing music from ABBA, Fleetwood Mac, The Doobie Brothers, The Carpenters, Chicago, the Bee Gees, and so many more artists. TV stations broadcast shows like All In The Family, Mary Tyler Moore, Soap, The Waltons, and Columbo. It was also the era of long gas lines, double-digit inflation, and rampant pollution of air, water, and land. Those were the days!

For the LGBT+ community, the 1970s began a time to celebrate newfound freedom after Stonewall, increasing awareness and visibility of our place in American society as we "came out of the closet". Supportive musicians like Diana Ross, Donna Summer, David Bowie, and Elton John helped clear a path for artists like Sylvester, Freddie Mercury, and Steve Grossman.

It is crucial for us to remember our history and the challenges we faced and overcame in the 1970s, as some of those challenges are beginning to resurface. The current Administration is taking steps to regress American society to pre-Stonewall, including attacks on Transgender brothers and sisters, denouncing equality and inclusion, removal of LGBT+-related terms from government web sites, and the exclusion of LGBT+ themes from public performances. The sudden cancellation of the Gay Men's Chorus of Washington DC at the Kennedy Center is an example of the latter. And the revisionist history of The Village People by its main member who claims it was never a "gay-themed" group underscores the current pressure to distance from the gay community. (You may notice that there are no songs from The Village People in today's concert.)

Yet we continue to sing. We continue to speak up. We continue to cherish our friends and neighbors in the Coachella Valley. Modern Men continues to reach out to community organizations in the area. We recently performed the National Anthem for the Coachella Firebirds for their Pride Night and performed at the Roost Lounge to benefit the Roost Foundation during their "Nest Fest" celebrations.

We look back at the 70s with feelings of joy and excitement and invite you to join in the celebration. Ongoing support from our donors, sponsors, and patrons like you has kept our voices alive to share messages of humanity and harmony, spirituality and silliness, passion and peace. And Discol

BIOGRAPHIES



Dr. Stan Hill ARTISTIC DIRECTOR

Since joining Modern Men as Artistic Director in August 2016, and in his 56th year conducting, Dr. Stan Hill brings to Coachella Valley audiences his witty, humanistic and iconoclastic approach to choral music and conducting. Well known in choral circles nationally, Stan served for 11 years as Artistic Director of the San Francisco Gay

Men's Chorus and then for 12 years as Artistic Director of Minnesota's Twin Cities Gay Men's Chorus before moving to Palm Springs in 2012.

A dynamic conductor, arranger, clinician and vocal coach, Stan's career spans the entire spectrum of elementary, secondary, university, church and community choruses. He has conducted every configuration of vocal ensemble and chorus with every combination of instrumentation from small ensembles to full symphony orchestras.

Dr. Hill has commissioned and premiered some of the most successful music in the gay men's chorus repertoire, including Naked Man, Exile, ExtrABBAganza, Misbehavin'I, Metamorphosis, Through a Glass, Darkly, The Kushner Trilogy, MOMENTum and many others. He has produced 13 CDs, several videos, and has written countless arrangements for men's choruses. In 2012, Hill was honored with the Gay and Lesbian Association (GALA) of Choruses' highest accolade: The Lifetime Achievement Award. In July 2016 Stan conducted the 20th Anniversary performance of Naked Man with over 350 singers and full orchestra for the opening blockbuster concert of the GALA conference in Denver. In October 2016 Stan was recognized by the San Francisco Gay Men's Chorus (SFGMC) with the honorific Conductor Laureate for the work he did to make SFGMC the extraordinary ensemble it is today, and for his tireless efforts for the chorus and community during the worst days of the AIDS pandemic. Stan is a member of the National Association of Teachers of Singing (NATS), and was on the voice faculty of California State University, Fullerton for four years. He is published in the 1986 edition of the NATS Journal. As a Choral Artistic Director, he brings a unique perspective on vocal pedagogy to his chorus rehearsals and assists singers with vocal problems.

A native of Southern California, Stan earned his Bachelor of Music and Master of Music, both in conducting, from California State University, Fullerton, where he studied under noted choral directors Harold Decker and David Thorsen. He earned his PhD from the University of Illinois at Urbana-Champaign, completing his dissertation on Laryngeal Physiology.



Kurt Jordan PRINCIPAL ACCOMPANIST

Kurt developed an intense interest in learning the piano after having seen The Phantom of the Opera with his parents at age 10. He studied under the guidance of Joann Algier throughout middle and high school, during which time he discovered a love of music using multiple pianos. This passion was further explored at Azusa Pacific University while studying with Dr. Robert Sage. Kurt performed several recitals of material he arranged for two and three pianos, the recordings of which have received radio play in Los

Angeles, Santa Barbara, Santa Cruz, Boston, Austin and Beirut. In 2009, Kurt had the honor of

performing the West Coast premiere of Alvin Curran's 7.5 hour long piano song cycle, *Inner Cities* 1-13, as well as the U.S. premiere of movement 14 at Burning Man in 2013. Kurt graduated from Azusa Pacific University in 2010 with a BA in Music Theory and Composition. Kurt has composed several large-scale works for piano solo, a song cycle for piano and soprano and most recently, a piano sonata.



Tom McGillis SIGN LANGUAGE INTERPRETER

Tom McGillis is an American Sign Language interpreter, providing services to the deaf community of the Coachella Valley in a wide variety of settings: arts and culture, academic, medical, conferences, meetings, social gatherings, and other events. Tom's career in American Sign Language interpretation, with a focus on interpreting artistic performances, spans more than 40 years.

He is the founder and principal of Stage Hands, LLC, a referral agency for interpreters for arts and cultural events.

This season marks Tom's seventh as American Sign Language interpreter for Modern Men. From 1988 until 2016, he served as the principal American Sign Language interpreter for the New York City Gay Men's Chorus.

His local theater credits include *Mr. Parker* (Dezarts Performs), Next to Normal (CV Rep), The Mouse Trap, Nunsense Amen, Escape to Margaritaville, and The Last Five Years (Desert Theater Works), and The Rocky Horror Show, and Those Musclebound Cowboys of Snake Pit Gulch (Desert Rose Playhouse). Tom has also interpreted concerts at Palm Springs Pride, Rock the Park (Palm Springs), Concerts in the Park (Palm Desert), and Voices of Kentuckiana. His prior theatrical interpreting credits include Forever Plaid at the Paper Mill Playhouse in Millburn, NJ, The Christmas Revels at Symphony Space in New York City, and several productions at the Very Special Arts Theater Company and the George Street Playhouse in New Brunswick, NJ. Tom has also voice interpreted signed performances, including Progress at the Hudson Guild Theater and Handstone Productions' Anna and Danilo, both in New York City.

Tom studied artistic interpreting at the Juilliard School and is a graduate of the interpreter training program at the New York Society for the Deaf, both in New York City. Tom has served on advisory boards and panels to help increase access, particularly in employment and the arts. He has presented workshops for the Gay and Lesbian Association of Choruses on issues in interpreting choral performances.

Tom holds a Master's in Business Administration degree from Baruch College of the City University of New York. In addition to Interpreting and advocacy on behalf of the deaf community, he has had a long career in human resources, serving most recently as Vice President of Human Resources for an international marketing research company. A New Jersey native, he lived in New York City for more than 30 years before moving to Palm Springs with his husband, Donald Gardenier (MM Baritone), in 2016.


Ron Wheeler PRODUCER






